## Shetland Islands Key statistics

## **Shetland Islands**

- Total population was **22,990** in 2018, a decrease of 1.1% from 2011.
- Population density (**16 people per sq. km**) is higher than that for the Highlands and Islands (**12 people per sq. km**) but lower than the Scottish average (**70 people per sq. km**).
- An age profile younger than the Highlands and Islands and in line with Scotland.
- A higher Economic Activity rate (84.7%) than the Highlands and Islands (80.9%) and Scotland (77.9%).
- A self-employed rate (8.2%) lower than the Highlands and Islands (11.0%) but in line with Scotland (8.7%).
- A higher Employment rate (84.7%) than the Highlands and Islands (78.6%) and Scotland (74.7%).
- An unemployment rate lower than the Highlands and Islands and Scotland. In September 2019, the rate was 1.5%, lower than the Highlands and Islands (2.3%) and Scotland (3.2%).
- School leaver positive destinations rates (i.e. not into unemployment) above the Scottish average.



By age breakdown, the Shetland Islands has a population structure similar to that of Scotland, and younger than the Highlands and Islands. In 2018, **48.5**% of the Shetland Islands population was aged over 45 years, compared to **52.5**% of the Highlands and Islands and Scotland (**46.5**%). While **27.8**% of the area's population was aged 0-24 years, compared to **25.6**% of the Highlands and Islands and **27.6**% of Scotland's population.

## **Employment**

In 2018, compared with the Highlands and Islands and Scotland, the Shetland Islands had a higher share of employment by industry in agriculture, forestry and fishing; construction; wholesale; transport and storage and arts, entertainment, recreation and other services.



Shetland had a higher share of employment by occupation in administrative and secretarial and elementary occupations compared to the Highlands and Islands and Scotland in 2018.

## Unemployment

The Shetland unemployment rate has been below that of the Highlands and Islands and Scotland over the period 2015-2019. The latest figures for September 2019 show that the Shetland Islands had a rate of 1.5%, compared to 2.3% in the Highlands and Islands and 3.2% in Scotland.
