# Highlands and Islands Key statistics

# Highlands and Islands

- Total population was **469,365** in 2018, an increase of 0.5% from 2011.
- Population density is significantly lower than the Scottish average **12 people per sq. km**, compared to **132 people per sq. km** in the rest of Scotland.
- An older age profile than Scotland.
- A higher Economic Activity rate than Scotland (80.9% compared to 77.9%).
- A greater percentage who are self-employed compared to Scotland (**11.0%** compared to **8.7%**).
- A higher Employment rate than Scotland (**78.6%** compared to **74.7%**).
- A higher share of employment by industry in agriculture, forestry and fishing; manufacturing; construction; transport and storage; accommodation and food services; public administration and defence and health.
- Unemployment rate lower than Scotland and the UK. In September 2019, the Highlands and Islands rate was **2.3%**, lower than Scotland (**3.2%**) and the UK (**2.8%**).
- School leaver positive destinations rates (i.e. not into unemployment) above the Scottish average.
- Productivity in the Nuts 2 area of Highlands and Islands **96.6%** of UK level.



By age breakdown, the Highlands and Islands had an older age profile than Scotland. In 2018, **22.8%** of the Highlands and Islands population was aged over 65 years, compared to **18.9%** in Scotland. While **25.6%** of the Highlands and Islands population was aged 0-24 years, compared to **27.6%** of Scotland's population.

## Employment

Compared with Scotland, the Highlands and Islands had a higher share of employment by industry in agriculture, forestry and fishing; manufacturing; construction; transport and storage; accommodation and food services; public administration and defence and health.




#### EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY (%), 2018

The Highlands and Islands also had a higher share of employment by occupation in skilled trades; administrative and secretarial; elementary; caring, leisure and other service and process, plant and machine operative occupations compared to Scotland.

### Unemployment

The Highlands and Islands unemployment rate has been below that of Scotland over the period 2014-2019 and was below that of the UK for most of the period. The latest figures for September 2019 show that the Highlands and Islands had a rate of **2.3%**, compared to **3.2%** in Scotland and **2.8%** in the UK.
