


UNEMPLOYMENT DIGEST

The Information contained in this report is based on Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) figures. The JSA records the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) and National Insurance credits at Jobcentre Plus local offices.

The December 2015 jobseekers allowance unemployment figures* were released on 20th January 2016.

As illustrated by the chart below, the Highlands and Islands continues to have significantly lower unemployment than either Scotland or the UK - a trend which has been fairly constant since the recession.




In December 2015, the average jobseekers allowance unemployment rate for the Travel to Work Areas (TTWAs) that comprise the Highlands and Islands was 1.1%, which was below the rates for both Scotland (1.7%) and the UK (1.5%). There was no change in the region's rate compared to the previous month, however, it was lower than a year earlier (1.4% in December 2014).

The TTWAs whose rates exceeded the Scottish average in December 2015 were Dunoon & Bute (2.8%); Campbeltown (2.0%) and Invergordon (1.8%). Five TTWAs in the Highlands and Islands had rates in December 2015 lower than 1.1% — Inverness & Dingwall and Mull & Islay (both 0.7%); Badenoch and Shetland Islands (both 0.5%) and Orkney Islands (0.4%).

The total number of people claiming unemployment benefit in the HIE area[^] in December 2015 was 3,287. Out of the total, some 1,310 were long term unemployed** and 495 were claimants aged 18-24.
